Logos: (Greek: "word," "reason," or "plan") in ancient Greek philosophy and early Christian theology, the divine reason implicit in the cosmos, ordering it and giving it form and meaning.

Vv 1-2 The Center of Our Relationship: Jesus Christ The Word of Life

The idea of the Logos – of the Word – was important for John and for the Greek and Jewish worlds of his day. For the Jew, God was often referred to as the Word because they knew God perfectly revealed Himself in His Word.

For the Greek, their philosophers had spoken for centuries about the Logos – the basis for organization and intelligence in the universe, the Ultimate Reason which controls all things. - Guzik Vv 1-2 The Center of Our Relationship: Jesus Christ Jesus is Eternal Life
